***We had been in the country 13 days and this was Bill's second run to Biem Island. You can see a bad mark under Bill's eye, that was the worse burn I had ever seen from the sun. It was raining and the waves beat on them the last run and so he didn't have sunscreen on. Thankfully I have some burn cream that has completely healed it without any scarring.***

Pray as we look to the Lord once again as we buy round trip tickets to San Diego in June. We will need to buy Jake's (NY-CA) as well!

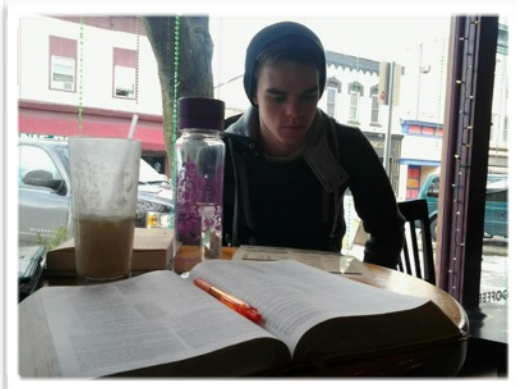
