Our language helper and pastor, George, with Amy and I as we study Kiswahili and the Bible. It has been a lot of fun learning the Bible stories and vocabulary in Kiswahili.

I guess you could call this time in our life and ministry here in Tanzania... 'Focused'. There are a handful of things that we are very focused on right now. First is our language acquisition. We have been putting in a few extra hours in order to prepare for a language evaluation, Mar 12 -14. Second is finding and moving into a house closer to the center of town for several reasons. Third is preparing for April when Amy will be attending a seminar in

Thailand on how to train language helpers. (She'll be gone 2 ½ weeks and I'll have all the kids to myself!) Another is helping our church here to purchase a building and renovate it so it can be usable for worship, classrooms, offices, etc. Amidst all this, we try to be intentional about ministering wherever we can; Our workers, families in the church, people in our neighborhood, and to each other. We know God is at work. It may be hard to see fruit right now, but we trust Him & His Word. There will be fruit.
