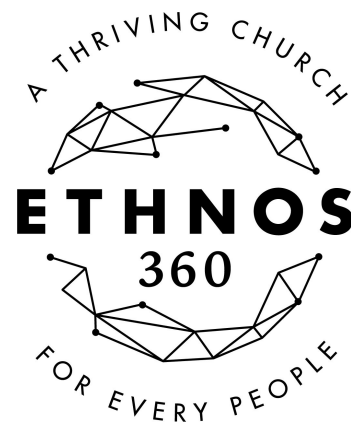

Even though we both grew up with friends and family who were missionaries, missions was still something that “others” did, not something we thought that we were meant to do. One day in 2013, an Ethnos360 missionary asked us, “What is your role in world missions?” That simple question planted the seed in our hearts to go.



We joined Ethnos360 in 2014, and moved to Papua New Guinea in 2017 with our four older kids, Liam, Esta, Aaron, and James. In February 2023, we were blessed to have Christopher join our family through adoption.

We are passionate about the work God is doing in PNG among some of the hardest to reach areas of the world. We want to see a thriving church for every tribe, language, and people in Papua New Guinea.

Why Papua New Guinea

Papua New Guinea is the most linguistically diverse country in the world with over 800 distinct language groups. Of these, about 300 still need to hear the gospel in their heart language. Ethnos360 (NTM PNG) has established over 400 churches in PNG since 1950, and currently has 43 active church plants across PNG. Each of those language groups has a team of missionaries teaching Bible lessons, discipling young and maturing churches, teaching literacy, and translating the scriptures ... and those teams use computers.

Supporting Tribal Church Planting through Information Technology

Since 2017, we've been part of the small IT team keeping the servers and networking equipment up and running for about 350 missionaries in PNG. This technology enables missionaries in “bush locations” to access resources and people that make Bible teaching and scripture translation smoother, quicker, and more accurate. It's also integral to the “behind the scenes” function of the day-to-day operations of a missionary support center.

We are using our God-given skills as part of the team translating the Bible and planting churches across Papua New Guinea, equipping those national churches to reach their neighbors with the Good News of Christ as well!
